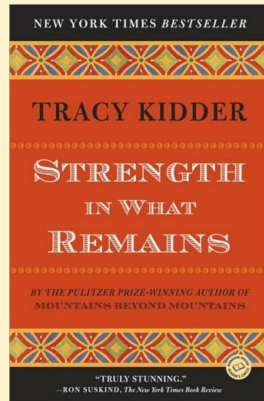
Wednesday, September 22 2:00 p.m.
